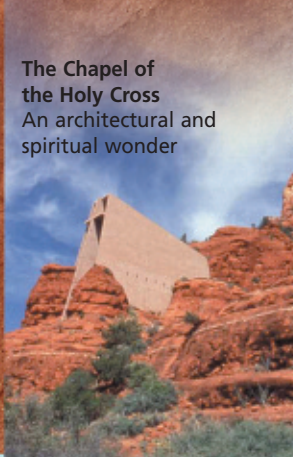

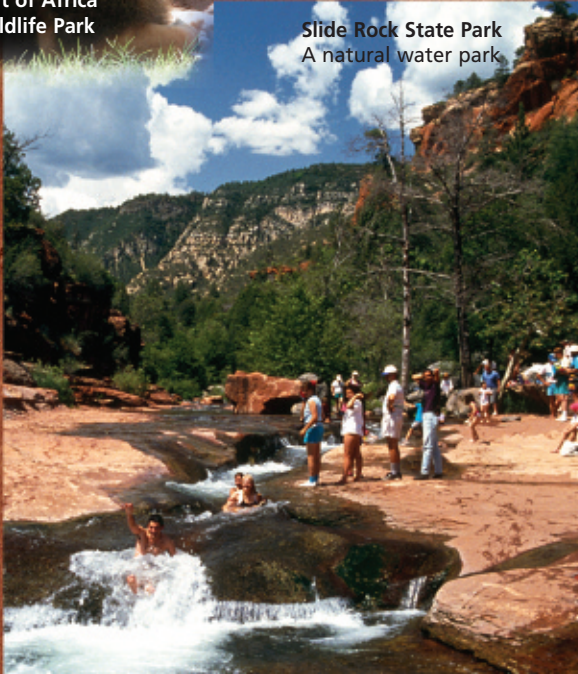

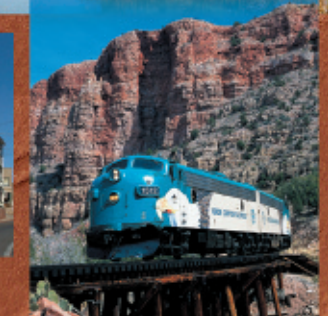

# MORE THAN 102 THINGS TO DO

◆ **SHOPPING:** Don't expect to find your typical malls here! Enjoy more than 100 galleries, shops and boutiques of contemporary and Native American Indian arts and culture. 350 artists reside in the area and exhibit and sell in local stores.

◆ **TOURS:** Take a guided jeep or horseback tour over and around the beautiful Red Rocks of Sedona...or above them with an air or balloon tour...or hop onto a Sedona trolley, or take a river tour and kayak on the Verde River and Oak Creek.

◆ **HIKING & BIKING:** Enjoy more than 100 trails in this outdoor wonderland.

◆ **GOLF:** A must play for all skill levels! 7 golf courses are open to the public. Your biggest handicap will be the distracting beauty of the scenery.

◆ **WILDLIFE & BIRD WATCHING:** Watch more than 400 exotic animals on a 104-acre wilderness preserve at Out of Africa Wildlife Park or discover more than 200 types of birds at the Verde Valley Birding and Nature Festival (or self guided at Red Rock State Park, Oak Creek Canyon, or Dead Horse Ranch State Park).

◆ **WELLNESS & SPA:** Not just a massage! Local high-quality (organic) products are used and certified therapists connect your body, mind and soul.

◆ **SPIRITUAL ENRICHMENT:** Sedona has a world-wide reputation as a spiritual mecca. Its power spots are globally recognized as "Vortexes". Amazing healers, intuitives, readers, practitioners and spiritual guides are available to work with you.

◆ **LIVE THEATRE:** The live theatre in Clarkdale stages 4-5 productions during each season from September to May.

◆ **RAIL EXCURSION:** View "Arizona's Longest-Running Nature Show" on Verde Canyon Railroad's train tour.

◆ **WINE TASTING:** Local wineries and vineyards produce handcrafted wines in both white and red varietals.

◆ **GAMBLING:** Cliff Castle Casino has been voted Arizona's favorite casino for 9 years in a row.

◆ **FESTIVALS & EVENTS:** So much, so many, so often! Come to "Jazz on the Rocks" in Sedona, "Fort Verde Days" in Camp Verde, Jerome's "First Saturday Art Walk," the "Made in Clarkdale" annual art show and sale or "Rhythm and Ribs" in Cottonwood. Check online for more.

◆ **SIGHTSEEING:** Cruise Uptown Sedona and Historic Old Town Cottonwood, or walk Jerome—the entire town is a national historic district. Visit 5 state parks, 2 national monuments and 3 heritage sites.

## Find yourself in Sedona Verde Valley!

### Time Zone:

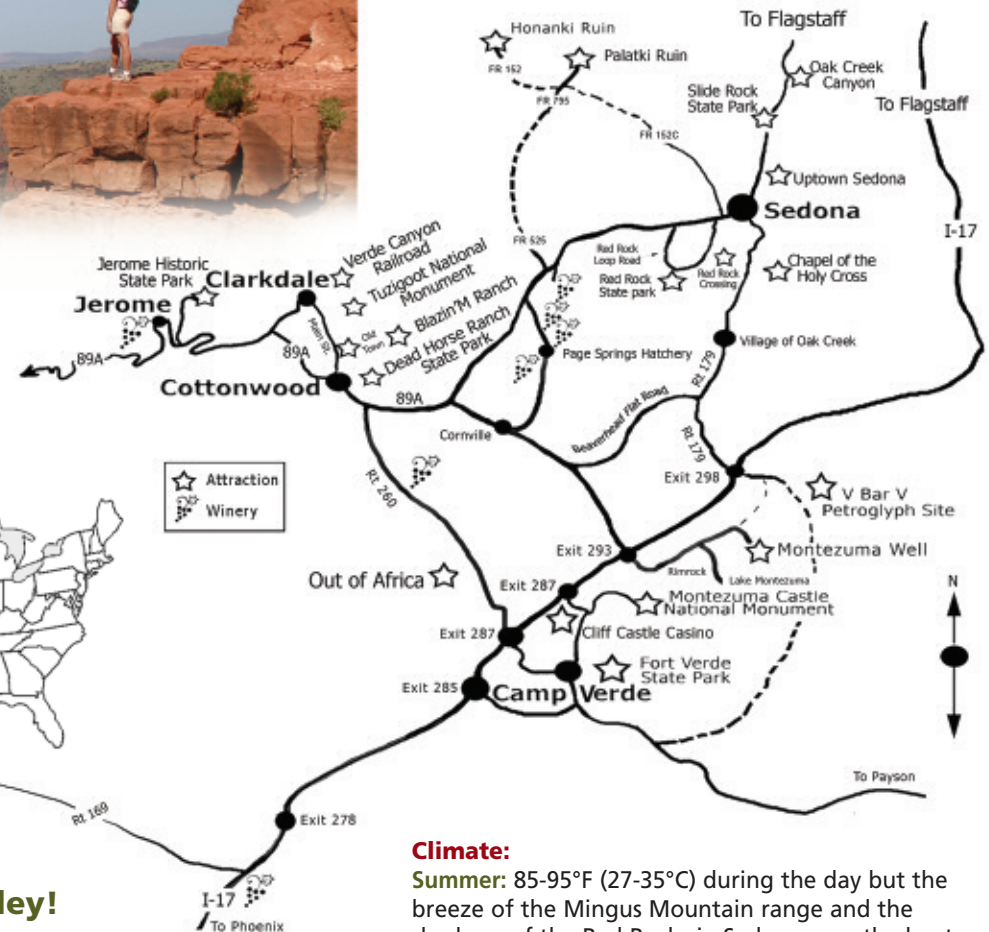
Arizona Time (MST all year; UTC -07:00)

### Distances:

- Phoenix – 2 hrs (120 miles / 193 km)
- Grand Canyon – 2.5 hrs (115 miles / 185 km)
- Flagstaff – 50 minutes (30 miles / 48 km)
- Las Vegas – 4.5 to 5 hrs (280 miles / 451 km)

- Sedona-Cottonwood: 30 minutes (20 miles / 32 km)
- Camp Verde-Clarkdale: 30 minutes (20 miles / 32 km)
- Cottonwood-Jerome: 15 minutes (9 miles / 14.5 km)
- Sedona-Camp Verde: 40 minutes (29 miles / 47 km)

The Sedona Verde Valley region is located between 3,160 ft (963m) and 5,435 ft (1,656 m). Roads leading from Phoenix and Prescott, or up and down through Oak Creek Canyon, are an exciting serpentine run with many stunning vistas and scenic sensations on the way. From Phoenix, take I-17 north.



### Climate:

**Summer:** 85-95°F (27-35°C) during the day but the breeze of the Mingus Mountain range and the shadows of the Red Rocks in Sedona ease the heat.  
**Winter:** mild with 55-65°F (12-18°C) with occasional days below freezing. There is rarely any snow.

### History and Population:

The communities forming the Sedona Verde Valley region were founded between 1865 and 1914 accommodating the needs of mining and military encampments in the area.

Today, Sedona, Cottonwood and Camp Verde all have populations of approximately 11,000. Clarkdale is much smaller with 3,715. The 330 souls in Jerome qualify its reputation as the "Largest Ghost Town in America."

The Sedona Verde Valley region celebrates "Small town U.S.A." and is home to the communities of Camp Verde, Clarkdale, Cornville, Cottonwood, Jerome, Page Springs, Sedona and the Yavapai-Apache Nation.
